

Regional New CTE Program Recommendation Submission Site is Now Available Online!

The CRC is pleased to announce that we have launched our new regional recommendation program submission website. All the regions in the state will eventually use this site, however, we are the second or third to go live with it. The site was designed and built by the Inland Empire/Desert Regional Consortium's (IE/DRC) web guru extraordinaire, Stephanie Gallo, in collaboration with James

Luevano of CodeStorm and the leadership of their Chair Julie Pehkonen.

We will continue to work with the other regions and the IE/DRC to make improvements to the site; and as you or your faculty use the site, your feedback will be extremely valuable. There soon will be added a pop-op window that will allow you to easily provide feedback. This site will be used for new CTE program submittals for regional review, as



well as for the CRC program reviewers. To create an account, go to <u>https://www.regionalcte.org/</u> then click "register" (found on the upper right hand

side of the page). You can also access the site via http://crconsortium.com/program-and-course-approval/ clicking on the Regional Recommendation Request Form. This will replace the CRC form that is currently in use.

If your college is planning to submit a program for recommendation, please share this website and ask your program faculty/staff to register as well. All users with an <u>.edu</u> e-mail address are automatically granted access once they create an account. If you use an e-mail address other than your college account, or if your college does not use an <u>.edu</u> domain, you will simply request an exception (a link is provided on the registration page).

In regards to LMI, please note, the PCAH 6th Edition (page 86) states: "Pursuant to Education Code section 78015 Labor Market Information (LMI) data is specifically required for all new CTE program proposals, where available. Current LMI and analysis, or other comparable information, must show that jobs are available for program completers within the local service area of the individual college and/or that job enhancement or promotion justifies the proposed curriculum."

The CRC relies on consistent LMI data provided by the region's COE in order to make a recommendation for program approval. At their discretion, colleges may submit other LMI data in addition to the LMI provided by the COE. You cannot submit a new form until LMI has been included. Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes are also still required. Once a program has been submitted and complete, the Program Reviewers have 10 business days to review the proposed curriculum, discuss amongst themselves, and ask questions of the CRC or the program submitter. The submitter and the CRC SC Dean will then be notified of the outcome.

SB1070 2017-18 Funding Priorities Survey

CRC COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

West Hills College Lemoore - CTE Academy

The West Hills College Lemoore (WHCL) CTE program strives to provide long-term, higher-wage job opportunities rather than low-paying entry level employment that doesn't requirement completion of a degree or certificate. However, the college recognizes the students' desire to find work quickly given the challenges of the regional economy. In order to reach both objectives, West Hills College Lemoore has adopted the CTE Academy approach for many of the CTE programs that are being developed or redesigned through the CTE Enhancement and Strong Workforce initiatives.

The CTE Academy approach emphasizes cohort groups and/or convenient scheduling for students who are exposed to engaging and rigorous industry-aligned curriculum while helping them to complete degree and certificate programs at a faster pace. In most instances, the revised scheduling also allows students the opportunity for part-time work experience in their desired field while they complete their program.

CTE Enhancement funds were used to enhance the Culinary/Hospitality, Business/Entrepreneurship, Information Communications Technology (ICT), and Paramedic programs at WHCL. In many cases, curriculum was revised to take advantage of the aforementioned cohort approach to learning. In addition, tablet computers were purchased to support classroom instruction.

West Hills College Coalinga

Psychiatric Technician

The Psychiatric Technician Program at West Hills College Coalinga is a 'marguis' program – in high demand because of the employment opportunities offered to graduates. The program trains candidates by combining theory and clinical experience in order to prepare them to take the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technician state board examination to become a Licensed Psychiatric Technician. Those who complete the certification are virtually assured a job at the nearby Coalinga State or Stockton State hospitals. CTE Enhancement Funds were used for professional development for health career faculty members, and to purchase computer software and mannequins. The software is what is found in medical front office environments and the mannequins are used for medical training replicating patient care. Professional development was needed to allow faculty and staff to train students in current and future industry standards.


