



California Trade Analysis Tool Summary

The California Trade Analysis Tool, which was designed by Jeanette Benson (Global Trade & Logistics DSN), brings to our region current trade data for California companies exporting and importing in order to best understand and assist with employer needs, in particular to fill gaps existing in other forms of labor market information. The tool captures trade data via subscriptions for trade data and feeds into the story mapping document to best analyze global trade down to the zip code level of the trading company. The tool contains three years of trade analysis which is mapped graphically.



The tool is the first to map trade specific to Mexico, also mapped to zip code level.

Inaugural South San Joaquin Valley Industrial Summit was held on October 26th, 2017 at the SCE Energy Education Center, Tulare, CA. Approximately 250 attendees from various organizations attended the Summit and participated in breakout sessions and listened to speeches from two of the newest Advanced Manufacturing Company leaders: Faraday Future, and GreenPower Motor Company Inc. Twenty businesses and organizations exhibited their products and services at the Summit and were very encouraged by the opportunities the Summit provided for them to reach potential customers in the South San Joaquin Valley.

Faraday Future and GreenPower Motor Company Inc. shared the future of green transportation, in particular, all-electric vehicles and how their products will be shaping the future of transportation. Regional Education & Workforce Resources Summit




Regional Education & Workforce Resources Summit was held on November 17th at the Radisson Hotel in downtown Fresno.

maintains a Nursing Simulation Lab which provides a safe, realistic and evidenced-based learning environment where skill development, decision-making and errors in thinking are reviewed. The labs support the nursing, Psychiatric Technician and Certified Nursing Assistant Program by

providing simulated patient care areas, equipment, supplies and technology that reflect current practice standards. Periodic upgrades are required to enhance and update these skills/simulation labs. CTE Enhancement Funds were used to upgrade equipment, including – updating the lab with patient headboards that provide oxygen and suctioning, critical care patient beds, and other simulation supplies that help provide patient support. Funds were also expended for revised curriculum and Professional Development. Because of this state-of-the-art lab, the college is the only one in the region that is able to 'train the trainers,' by offering training to nursing faculty.

Reedley College offers an assortment of courses and majors related to various fields of agriculture. The Agribusiness program recognizes that most agriculture jobs are in the business and management sectors – offering careers in agriculture economics, international trade and sales and farm management. Reedley's extensive facilities include an on-site farm and renowned Animal Sciences department. CTE Enhancement funds were used to remodel the Agriculture Business Computer Lab. Furniture and computers were purchased. Within the Animal Science program the Reedley Meats lab and cooler is used to prepare students for careers which require food safety techniques.






