Advanced Manufacturing 101 Helps Teachers Improve Design of CTE Programs



Pathway educators were invited to tour two manufacturing facilities on March 30th, as a part of the Advanced Manufacturing 101 series. American Incorporated, a "Design and Build" HVAC manufacturer in Visalia, CA, and Pregis, a packing supply manufacturer also in Visalia, opened their doors to local educators providing real world/practical examples for the lessons taught in their classrooms.

Nicole Wright, Plant Manager at Pregis, personally lead the tour encouraging teachers saying, "What you teach them matters! Everything our employees need to know to be successful at our plant, they learn in high school." This was the first time Wright opened her plant to educators, and she was surprised how interested and involved teachers were in the manufacturing process.

Creating Skills for the STEM/STEAM Economies

The CCCCO DWN framework recognizes the importance of STEM/STEAM to the creative economies of the state. In partnership with the California Council on Science & Technology, the CCC Workforce & Economic Development Division commissioned a white paper to inform how community colleges can better connect into the Maker movement to complement the student learning environment in ways that foster the 4Cs – critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communications – in demand by California's regions. Community colleges can use the establishment of a Makerspace as a means to position themselves as a key stakeholder in their region's innovation economy. California Community Colleges Board of Governors Approves Plan to Change Accreditation

On March 21st, the California Community Colleges approved plans to better align the system's 113 colleges with other segments of higher education through changes to the current accreditation structure.

The Board of Governors declared that the community college system's establishment of a bachelor's degree program and its strengthened transfer pathways require peer review from four-year colleges and universities to ensure top quality for students.

Dual Enrollment and Assembly Bill 288 (CCAP) Legal Opinion 16-02

Assembly Bill 288 (Holden) was enacted January 1, 2016 and added to the California Education Code section 76004. Assembly Bill 288 enables the governing board of a community college district to enter into a College and Career

Access Pathways (CCAP) partnership with the governing board of a school district. For the first time in California's Education Code, the term "dual enrollment" is identified to define "special part-time" or "special full-time" students – that is, high school or other eligible special admit students enrolling in community college credit courses.

The purpose of this Legal Opinion is two-fold: to opine on the key legal issues regarding:

- CCAP partnerships under AB 288; and
- Districts' ability to operate outside of the CCAP framework (that is, either develop or continue existing non-CCAP partnership agreements and other dual enrollment, non-cohort programs in general).

This Legal Opinion incorporates both the 2005 Legal Advisory and its 2015 update, and addresses the subsequent enactment of AB 288.

California Community College Board of Governors Appoints Skinner as Acting Chancellor

On March 21, the California Community Colleges Board of Governors appointed Deputy Chancellor Erik Skinner as acting chancellor for the California Community Colleges beginning April 2. In a separate action, the board also awarded Brice W. Harris with the honorary title of Chancellor Emeritus of the California Community Colleges.

The Board of Governors is currently engaged in a national search for a permanent new chancellor for California Community Colleges. The board plans to have the new chancellor in place by the beginning of the 2016–17 academic year.

2016–17 Governor's Budget Released

The newly released Governor's Proposed 2016–17 Budget included several items of significance relating to a strong workforce in California. Highlights include:

- **Workforce** – \$200 million added to the EWD item to improve and expand efforts for workforce, consistent with recommendations made the the Task Force on Workforce, Job Creation and Strong Economy.
- **CTE Pathways (SB1070)** – \$48 million is funded for this program on an ongoing basis.
- **Apprenticeship** – \$1.8 million is provided for the purpose of providing parity to apprenticeship rates

relating to various general purpose funding augmentations received by colleges in 2015–16 for a new total of \$53.75M.

Draft \$200 Million Guidance from the CCCCCO

On a related note, last week, Vice Chancellor Van Ton–Quinlivan and Acting Vice Chancellor Mario Rodriguez released the "Draft Guidance to the Field on the Administration of the \$200M Strong Workforce Program" which clarifies the CCCCCO's intent for distributing the \$200M highlighted in the proposed trailer bill language (<http://goo.gl/Rmrx17>) of the 2016–17 Governor's Budget.

According to Vice Chancellor Ton–Quinlivan, the Chancellor's Office draft document outlines key provisions of the Governor's proposal and highlights areas that are being actively deliberated in the legislative process. It is being shared with the understanding that the 2016–17 Governor's Budget proposal is still working its way through the legislative budget process and resulting amendments will impact the content. Once the final details of the 2016–17 State Budget have been determined, the CCCCCO will refine the guidance to the field.

CVHEC Phase 2 Regional Efforts to Reduce Remediation

CAP Design and Development Institute, Sept 9–11, 2016
Community of Practice, 2016–17, Multiple Dates

Across California, community colleges are replacing long remedial sequences in reading, writing, and mathematics with redesigned accelerated pathways. This can involve significant changes to classroom instruction. The California Acceleration Project (CAP) offers an extended program to support faculty to teach in accelerated pathways.

The Central Valley Institute will be designed for colleges at earlier stages of implementation. The focus will include building support, developing curricular models, thinking about placement policies, and getting an introduction to CAP pedagogy. If your college is ready to offer accelerated pathways, your campus is encouraged to apply to Community of Practice, either in the north or south, to get in-depth support.
