Proposal: Special Education Paraprofessional

Item 1. Program Goals and Objectives

Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. Demonstrate introductory subject matter competency required for working in special education classrooms in kindergarten to grade 12 settings.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of social, cultural, environmental, and aesthetic perspectives necessary for working in special education classrooms in kindergarten to grade 12.
- 3. Discuss historical influences and current trends in education, as well as teaching strategies and approaches appropriate for students of diverse, needs, abilities and backgrounds.

Item 2. Catalog Description

The Special Education Paraprofessional Certificate of Achievement prepares students to work as paraprofessionals in special education classrooms in kindergarten through grade 12 (K-12) school settings. Completing the certificate satisfies the federal No Child Left Behind requirements for employment in a school districts and is the foundation for the Associate degree for Transfer in Elementary Education.

Item 4. Master Planning

The Special Education Paraprofessional Certificate of Achievement will fulfill Fresno City College's mission by preparing students to work and for transfer. The Certificate meets industry requirements for

employment as well as providing a first step towards completion of an associate degree for transfer, which will lead to a bachelor's degree and a teaching credential. Labor Market projections indicate there will be a 10% increase in the number of jobs for paraprofessionals between 2012 and 2022, and a 9% increase in jobs for special education teachers in elementary schools for the same time period.

Previously Fresno City College offered a 20-22 unit Certificate of Achievement which included some of the courses listed in Item 3 however the value of that certificate was limited, because it did not meet industry standards for employment, and it did not provide any specific coursework focused on working in special education classrooms.

Related programs offered by Fresno City College include the proposed Special Education Paraprofessional Assistant Certificate of Achievement and the Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer.

Item 7. Similar Programs at Other Colleges in Service Area

Fresno Adult School offers a short-term course to prepare adults to take the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) exam which qualifies them to work as paraeducators. However that course is non-credit bearing and does not provide any specialized content for working in special education. Additionally it is not a step towards a transcripted certificate, a degree or credential.

Reedley College and Clovis Community College both offer an AAT in Elementary Teacher Education but neither have any courses which focus on special education or any Certificates of Achievement in the field of Education or Liberal Studies.

The Certificate was developed in consultation with the advisory committee for Child Development and Education which included community members representing industry and 4-year colleges.
