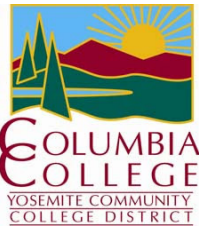

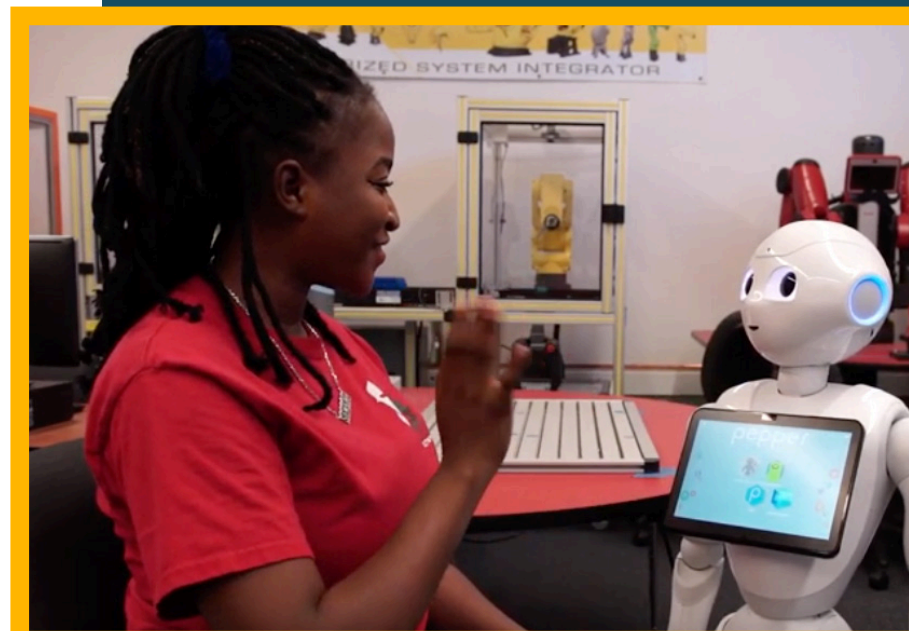
ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

Advanced manufacturing plants use advanced technologies to create existing products and develop new products and processes. Advanced manufacturing can include production activities that depend on information, automation, computation, software, sensing, and networking. Computer-Aided Design and Drafting (CADD), Computer-Aided Manufacturing (CAM), Computer Numerical Control (CNC) and 3-D printing are all examples of the technologies that are a part of the advanced manufacturing processes of designing and producing products.

Bottled water, the cheese on your pizza, the cup your designer coffee comes in, the pen you write with, your washer and dryer at home, your cell phone – all of the things you experience or consume every day are examples of products produced in manufacturing plants that use advanced technologies. Annual openings for advanced manufacturing jobs in the Central Valley/Mother Lode Region range between nine for automation robotics technicians, and 586 for first-line supervisors of production and operating workers.

No matter which career you choose in this sector, technology will be a part of your everyday job, whether you are operating a machine or fixing it. The median hourly pay ranges between \$20/hour and \$47/hour.

AGRICULTURE, WATER & ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNOLOGIES

With the Central Valley producing 25% of the nation's food, and 40% of the nation's fruits, nuts and table foods,¹ you can bet Valley community colleges offer some of the top agricultural programs in the country that are some of the oldest, with Bakersfield College's program dating back to 1915. Careers in agriculture go beyond planting and harvesting. You could choose a career providing veterinary services or working in wholesale trade. Maybe you're interested in installing and maintaining the systems that water crops or helping to keep crops pest-free? Careers in agriculture are diverse and highly technological. Annual openings for agriculture jobs in the Central/Mother Lode Region range between 33 for food scientists and technologists, and 793 for first-line supervisors of farming, fishing and forestry workers.

ENERGY, CONSTRUCTION & UTILITIES

Careers in this sector pay well. Some also come with the satisfaction of knowing you're doing your part to help the planet. The advanced energy sector is creating 15,000 jobs each year in California, and many of those jobs start at \$40,000 a year, with the chance to move up to a \$100,000 annual salary over time.¹ Solar voltaic installers, electricians and HVAC technicians are all jobs within this sector. You can specialize in power utilities, which involves creating and delivering power to homes and businesses; making buildings energy efficient; or developing and harnessing renewable energy sources, such as solar, wind and geothermal. Annual openings for energy, construction and utilities jobs in the Central/Mother Lode Region range between 116 for solar photovoltaic installers, and 1,746 for general maintenance and repair workers.

GLOBAL TRADE

International trade is a major economic driver for the state of California. You can become a part of an international trade industry that exports to more than 200 foreign markets, with California exporting \$171.9 billion in 2017. Our state is home to the two largest U.S. ports – the Port of Long Beach and the Port of Los Angeles. Together, they exported nearly half of all of California's exports. According to the California Chamber of Commerce, the state's trade and exports translate into high-paying jobs for more than 1 million Californians. Annual openings for global trade jobs in the Central/Mother Lode Region range between 150 for sales representatives, wholesale and manufacturing, technical and scientific products, and 1,255 for sales representatives, wholesale and manufacturing, except technical and scientific products.

Annual openings for health jobs in the Central/Mother Lode Region range between 38 for occupational therapy assistants, and 2,318 for registered nurses.

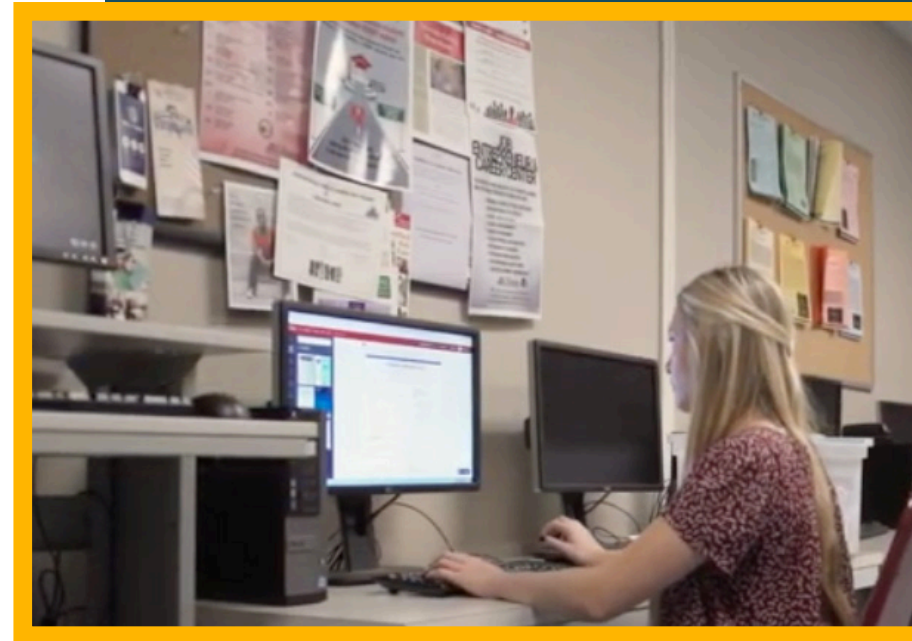


INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES/DIGITAL MEDIA

Reliable, functioning computer systems and communications technology are essential to business operations. In this sector, you can specialize in hardware and get the training you need to work for a company that manufactures computer parts and related equipment. You may choose to specialize in software and receive training to work for a company that develops computer operating systems and applications, or you can be trained to work for a company that uses hardware, software and other services together to address business needs. Annual openings for information communication technologies/digital media jobs in the Central/Mother Lode Region range between 22 for multimedia artists and animators, and 351 for computer-user support specialists.

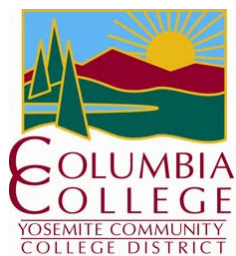

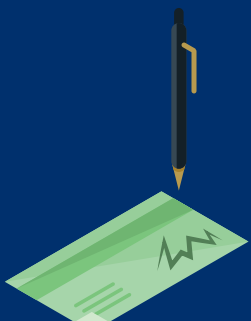
