K-12 Strong Workforce Program Updates

ROLLOUT AND IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE FOR 2019-20 K12 PATHWAY COORDINATORS ANNOUNCED

Earlier this week the CCCCCO released their Strong Workforce Program K12 Pathway Coordinator Timeline and Scope of Work memo. Per SWP legislation, only K12 LEAs as defined by Education Code Section 88833(a)(2) will be eligible to the hosts for these positions. The CRC will identify in the coming weeks a process to recruit and select hosts for each of the K12 Pathway Coordinators.

The distribution of K12 Pathway Coordinators per legislation is 1 per community college district. The chart shows the regional distribution. To leverage past investments in technical support for CTEIG, selected LEAs will be pre-approved to transition CTEIG TAPs into the K12 Pathway Coordinator positions. The Regional Consortia will reach out to the pre-approved LEAs to confirm their willingness to transition the CTEIG TAPs into this new role.

The K12 Pathway Coordinators are intended to seek to improve the performance of the K14 CTE programs within their service areas as measured by the CTEIG, K-12 SWP Metrics and guided by the K14 Pathway Quality Rubric. They are further intended to provide direct support to, and help to link and align the program development efforts funded by CTEIG, K-12 SWP and Community College SWP investments in the service area, as well as coordinate with other regional key talent including the K-14 TAP, Regional Directors for Employer Engagement, the Centers of Excellence, Guided Pathway Regional Coordinators, and the Regional Consortium. Guidance on K12 SWP Selection Committees —2019-20 K12 SWP:

The CRC is pleased to announce that all members of the CRC K12 SWP Selection Committee have agreed to continue to serve. Two members were unable to continue; however, they were replaced with Selection Committee members on the alternate list. The CRC K12 SWP Selection Committee does not have any vacancies and is not adding any new members.

The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO), in partnership with the California Department of Education (CDE), is pleased to present field guidance on the K12 Selection Committee process for 2019–20.

Beginning in 2018–2019, Education Code §§ 88827 established the K12 component of the Strong Workforce Program appropriating \$150,000,000 in annual ongoing career technical education funding to strengthen the programs and programs of study for students from secondary to postsecondary education and career. K12 SWP intends to create, support, and/or expand high-quality career education programs at the K12 level

that are aligned with the regional priorities of the community college workforce development efforts occurring through the Strong Workforce Program. In 2018-2019, each of California's eight community college Regional Consortia convened a Selection Committee (to serve for two years) to review applications and make final recommendations for K12 SWP awards.

The tasks of the Selection Committee include:

- review regional applications, select grant recipients, and determine funding amount for each grant using the rubrics provided; and,
- report on the amount awarded to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, State Board of Education, and Department of Finance.
