Mission

Statement of Program Goals and Objectives

Program goals:

- 1. Prepare students for careers as a videographer, photographer, motion graphics designer, animator, video editor, film editor, and filmmaker.
- 2. Connect with local industry professionals for advice and guidance;
- 3. Maintain a facility that meets industry standards
- 4. Provide courses that also may fit into the local AA-T degree for students who plan to transfer.

Objectives

- 1. To provide a local program to prepare students for entry-level positions in media arts related fields.
- 2. To introduce students to industry standard software, hardware, and techniques, principles and methods.
- 3. To provide a course sequence that develops student skills

Catalog Description

This program will provide opportunities for students to attain skills in media arts. The program will challenge students to think critically, communicate, and demonstrate competencies and skills in animation, motion graphics, and video production.

Upon completion of the following courses with at least a "C" grade in each course, a student will be awarded a Certificate of Achievement in Media Arts.

Background and Rationale

The Department has two 18-unit certificates, one in graphic design and one in photography. This program is a logical extension of the photography and graphic design courses currently offered in the Art Department. Visual communicators increasingly need Media arts skills, and this program will provide entry-level competencies for a number of career paths.

This 18-unit certificate was written in consultation with the Digital Arts Advisory Committee, and will provide a clear and quick career pathway for students seeking entry-level media arts positions. The program allows students to complete it in 4 semesters, and the courses in the sequence are up to date.

Need

In AY 2014/2015 there were 490 students who completed either a graphic design or photography course at Bakersfield College. 22 to 25 students finish the capstone course of ART B42 for the graphic design certificate. The faculty feels that this program has the potential to have a similar completion rate.
