Climate Partnership: Advancing ZEV

- **\$2M Funding** : Partnership with CARB to advance, accelerate and expand impact
- **Release RFP** to system; collaborate with CARB SMEs on awardee selection
- **Distribute funding** to community college ZEV training programs
- **Expand impact** driven by campuses building on existing CTE programs and employer partnerships



Climate Partnership: Microgrids

- Provide technical assistance in partnership with California Renewable Energy Lab and National Renewable Energy Lab to campuses wanting to implement microgrids
- Release CFI to system; collaborate with CREL and NREL on campus selection
- Microgrid readiness providing campuses with a full analysis and bid spec on implementation needs

What is your program & who does it serve?



Needs Mapping

- 1. What strengths/value does each college in the region bring?
- 2.What strengths/value does the region bring as a collaborative?
- 3.Are there gaps?
- 4.How might CVML articulate a vision in alignment with regional goals?





Find & Connect with Funders

- Funders are trying to solve problems, scale impact, and make their dollars count
- Meet the funder's challenge:
 - How do your regional strengths answer that challenge?
 - How do your regional priorities align with the funder's?
- What additional resources or expertise through strategic partnership are you able to bring to the conversation?



Leveraging Funding Types

- Philanthropy + SWP/state + federal = stronger and more sustainable program
- Identify and understand allowable vs unallowable expenses by funding type
- Use philanthropic and/or general funds to fill gaps around allowable expenses
